General Rights of Tenants include:

The tenant has the right to expect a livable rental unit. Livability means that the unit should:

Tenants have a right to 24-hour advance notice of the owner's intent to enter the property, except in case of an emergency.

When a tenant has provided a written request for repairs to the landlord, he/she has the right to a prompt response (a period of 30 days is usually deemed reasonable for most non-emergency repairs).

Tenants must receive 30 days written notice of a rent increase under 10%. The tenant must receive 60 days written notice for a rent increase over 10%.

Tenants must receive the return of their security deposit within 21 days of vacating a unit. They have a right to an itemized statement of any money withheld by the landlord. If there is a deposit deficiency (money owed) tenant must pay landlord promptly.

General Tenant Responsibilities include:

Tenants must honor their agreements by:

- paying rent on or before the due date, including any agreed late charges
- keeping the unit clean and sanitary
- respecting the rights of neighbors
- caring for and respecting the premises, including using gas, electrical, and plumbing fixtures properly
- fixing or paying for repairs of things they or their guests damage
- not removing anything from the structures or buildings they have not put there and not allowing anyone else to do so
- limiting the number of people living in the unit
- using the premises as a place to live with the rooms used for their intended purpose; for example, the bedroom is not a kitchen
- to vacate the premises promptly pursuant to proper termination notice
